He was a gifted salesman and Account Executive, selling cyber security software at Okta. His true love in life was bass fishing in Northern Minnesota; he spent the majority of his free time chasing fish around the many lakes in Minnesota with his brother and close friends. In 2012, he founded Bass Predator, an apparel line many of his friends and family could be found wearing on a regular basis. Jake was a man of faith and deeply dedicated to his family. His many friendships were marked by good times and fierce loyalty. He was adored and cherished by his girlfriend, Megan Feyereisen. His warm, fun-loving aura could be sensed from across the room, which made him the favorite among children of all ages and earned him the nickname Baby Lover. Just days before his passing, he became a proud new homeowner in New Hope, where he planned to raise his Bernese Mountain dog puppy, Evie, named after the Evinrude motor on his beloved Bass Cat boat.
