

## Kinney George Misterek

Kinney George Misterek was born August 26, 1955, in Pierre, South Dakota. He was the son of Vernard and Ellen (Kinney) Misterek. He attended school in North and South Dakota, graduating from Stanley County High School in Fort Pierre, South Dakota, in 1973. Kinney attended the University of South Dakota (USD) in Vermillion, SD, graduating with Bachelor's degrees in History and Political Science. He then attended graduate school at USD, eventually completing his Master's degree in Business Administration. Kinney worked at a bank in Sioux Falls, SD, for about a year, and then began his 34-year career at the Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis on June 1, 1980.

On May 23, 1981, he married Susan Diane Amundson at First Lutheran Church in Battle Lake, MN. They lived in the Minneapolis area for the next 35 years.

Kinney was devoted to his work at the Federal Reserve Bank, and worked in various areas within the banking supervision function, including bank holding company supervision, consumer affairs, and risk management. He was a commissioned examiner who was committed to preserving the safety and soundness of banking and financial systems. During the recent financial crisis, he was on loan to the Treasury department in Washington as part of their efforts to repair the economy.

Kinney was committed to education, both as a student and as a professor. While at the Federal Reserve Bank, Kinney completed his Master's in Business Taxation at University of Minnesota. He also completed various accounting and financial certifications, including his CPA and CMA. Kinney taught training classes at the Federal Reserve as part of his work, including serving as an instructor in Washington, DC, for system-wide bank examiner training; and internationally, training employees of Central Banks in Latvia, Mexico, Egypt, Cambodia, and others. Kinney also taught accounting classes evenings and on weekends at Metropolitan State University, and for over 25 years for Augsburg College.

Kinney experienced significant health problems, and retired in August of 2014. He then lived at the Legacy of St. Anthony until passing away on November 7, 2016. Kinney is survived by his wife of 35 years, Susan, of St. Anthony, his mother Ellen of Columbia Heights brother Edward of Minneapolis, sister Mary Barrett (Michael Barrett) and nephews Christopher Barrett and Pierce Barrett of Brush Prairie, WA, uncle Patrick

Kinney of Santa Cruz, CA, aunt Elizabeth Shelquist of Mounds View, MN, uncle Robert T. Shelquist of San Diego, CA, and cousin Robert K. Shelquist (wife Kimberly, children Caroline and Connor) of Tonka Bay, MN. He was preceded in death by his father, Vernard Misterek, of Ft. Pierre, SD, and grandparents, John and Lu Kinney of San Diego, CA, and Edward and Bertha Misterek, of Harold, SD.
