Although he was never in the military, Sanford considered himself to be a member of "The Lord's Army".

On October 24, 1953, Sanford married Mary Joanne Heggen of Brandon, South Dakota. Together, they lived a life of dedication to the Lord and commitment to one another.

Sanford loved to work with his hands and became a toolmaker, working 29 years at Northwest Airlines before retirement. He also enjoyed traveling, taking advantage of the airline's employee flight privileges. In addition to his machining career, Sanford liked tinkering in his workshop and doing many remodeling projects on his home. He also loved music, especially gospel quartet.
