



## Tandyn Scott Krenz

September 12, 1970 - August 15, 2019

Tandyn Scott Krenz, age 48, beloved son, husband, uncle, friend, and colleague passed away peacefully at his home in Minneapolis on August 15th, 2019 after a long, courageous battle with bile duct cancer. Originally from Tipton, Iowa, Scott, also known as T. Scott and 'Scooter', attended Tipton High School, where he ran track and cross country, and went to the Iowa state track meet in the 4 x 100 relay. Mr. Krenz attended the University of Iowa to study photojournalism and had numerous photos published in the Daily Iowan newspaper which illustrated many stories, including Hawkeye football games, the great Iowa floods, and President Clinton's visit to the Quad Cities. Rolling Stone magazine also selected one of his photos for its annual College Special issue. Mr. Krenz's love of education drew him to academia, where he worked in instructional design, the art of developing instructional materials to support meaningful learning experiences. He had the pleasure of supporting faculty and students at the University of Iowa Dental School, Augsburg College, and the University of Minnesota Pharmacy and Medical Schools. Mr. Krenz was also an avid arts appreciator who attended opera, plays, the symphony, dance, and numerous museums. He was known for his quick wit and kind and caring manner with everyone he met. He will be deeply missed by all. Mr. Krenz is survived by his husband Eric McEnaney of Minneapolis, his parents Gene and Myra Krenz and brother Jusdyn (Ramona) Krenz, all of Cedar Rapids, IA, his nieces and nephews, Collin and Madison (Ashley) Krenz, Alisha, Alexander, Collin, Connor, and Grace McEnaney, and countless friends, colleagues, and family members. A memorial service will take place Tuesday, August 27th, 6pm at Washburn-McReavy Edina Chapel, 5000 W. 50th St., Edina, MN. Visitation will begin two hours prior at 4pm.
