The family moved to Hoyt Lakes, MN in October of 1957. Alice graduated high school from Aurora-Hoyt Lakes High School and graduated college from UMD. At both schools, she met lifelong friends. Friends who would be with her in fun times, hard times, adventurous times, creating memories and shaping each other for the better.

Her daughter, Kim (Mel) Larsen, arrived in 1969. In the eyes of her daughter, she was a heroic and self giving parent. May she rest in peace and the rest of us laugh spontaneously and give like she did.

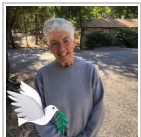
