Strobel, Alice Founding member of United Theological Seminary, died at her home in New Brighton on December 15, 2012. She was 90 in years, but ageless in mind and spirit. Alice was also brilliant, compassionate, generous, profoundly attuned to the feelings of others, adventurous and brave. She and her husband Bob traveled the world in the days before world travel became fashionable and easy; she worked tirelessly to ensure equality and justice for the most vulnerable; and she had an unprecedented ability to smooth life's path for everyone fortunate enough to know her. In addition to serving as registrar and director of academic services at United Seminary until her retirement in 1987, Alice worked at Union Theological Seminary in New York and was director of the YWCA in Honolulu, Hawaii, where, among other duties, she coached a championship basketball team. Alice's life was an accomplished, meaningful and immensely influential one but she will be remembered most for who she was: extraordinarily strong and joyful, open hearted, open minded, a fiercely dedicated friend to people and animals and an extraordinary light in the world. For those who loved her the light remains. Alice will be buried next to her husband at Sunset Cemetery. A service celebrating her life will take place at Plymouth Congregational Church in Minneapolis on Saturday, May 18 at 1:00 PM.
