An intelligent, optimistic, gentle young man, Andrew Earl Story, age 23, passed away at his home on December 7, 2020. Born in Minneapolis, MN on October 6, 1997, Andrew is survived by his parents, Jeff and Emily Story, his sister Ella, his grandparents Terry Iverson (Bernice Berns), Tom and Sandy Story and many other treasured family members and friends. He was preceded in death by his maternal grandmother, Barbara Jean (Baldwin) Iverson.

Andrew Story was soft spoken, and he rarely wanted to be the center of attention. He enjoyed listening to others and loved to learn. Andrew excelled in many sports, especially baseball and golf. While playing on the Eden Prairie baseball team that won a number of state tournaments, Andrew had the opportunity to play at Target Field. Most of all, he played for the love of the game and showed amazing sportsmanship in either a win or a loss.

Andrew graduated from Eden Prairie High School in 2016. He then graduated with honors from Marquette University in Milwaukee, Wisconsin in 2020 with a major in physics. From an early age, Andrew was creative and inventive. He enjoyed figuring out how things work and also experimented with putting abstract ideas to work. As an example, during a college internship, he collaborated with his professor to build an infra-red laser.

Andrew believed in social and financial equity, and he accepted people from all walks of life regardless of economic, social, racial or religious differences. Andrew disliked unfairness or injustice on any level. He rarely put himself above anyone else - in school, on his sports teams, in his family. He was able to empathize and demonstrate compassion for others.
