



## Anedith Jo Nash

August 27, 1943 - July 23, 2020

Ms. Anedith Jo Nash (née Bond), of Minneapolis, Minnesota, passed away on Thursday, July 23, 2020 at the age of 76.

Anedith Nash was born in Waco, Texas, and as an undergraduate attended Baylor University, where her father was chairperson of the Chemistry Department and her mother served as an assistant on the executive staff. She earned a Masters Degree in Political Science/International Organization and Economics from Washington State University, and a PhD in American Studies from the University of Minnesota. She taught and administered at various Twin Cities schools and programs, including an urban studies consortium, before becoming Professor and Academic Dean at the Minneapolis College of Art and Design. She left that position to serve as Academic Dean at the Oregon College of Art and Craft in Portland, Oregon, and finished her career as Provost at the Columbus College of Art and Design in Ohio. In retirement she returned to Minnesota to be near her son Jason and his family and to live with her partner, Rob Silberman. She kept engaged with the art school community by helping art schools and programs across the nation achieve accreditation.

Anedith loved teaching, mentoring and working with others to get things done. She also loved art, American Sign Language, the mountains in Colorado,

singing, horseback riding, Golden Retrievers, and above all, always, her friends and family. She is survived by her sons Marcus Nash and Jason (Vicki) Nash from her marriage to Jeff Nash (which ended in divorce); brothers Tom (Kate) Bond and Bob (Kay) Bond, four nieces and seven grandchildren, and Rob Silberman.

No service is currently scheduled. The family is grateful for condolences, and encourages those who loved Anedith to make a contribution that would honor her memory to a school or charity of their choice.

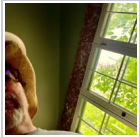
