Age 89 of Apple Valley passed away 5/14/17. Survived by son, Steven (Donna) Stewart; granddaughter, Shalana Stewart; and many special friends. Annalee started her early career as a probation officer but after receiving her masters, she started teaching social work at the University of Minnesota. She was the first single female to adopt an international child in the United States. Annalee came out in her fifties and was a strong advocate for gay and lesbian rights.
