



## Augustine Ajibola Sere

July 10, 1948 - August 4, 2025

Augustine Ajibola Sere, born on July 10, 1948, in Abeokuta, Ogun State, Nigeria, passed away peacefully on August 4, 2025, in Minneapolis, Minnesota, at the age of 77.

A devoted husband, father, grandfather, brother, and friend, Augustine is survived by his beloved wife, Sarah Anne Sere; and by their children: Helena Adjei and her husband Koffi Adjei; Anthony Sere and his wife Francesca Sere; Joseph Sere and his wife Sheriss Joy Sere; Anthonia Sere; Elizabeth Chukwuemeka and her husband Daniel Chukwuemeka; and Nina Munson and her husband Kris Munson.

Augustine attended St. Gregory's College for his secondary education. In 1978, he came to the United States and attended Dunwoody College of Technology, where he earned a degree in Surveying and Civil Engineering Technology. He spent his career as a civil engineer, participating in the

development of several rural parts of Nigeria, leading surveying and road construction projects that helped transform rural areas into thriving urban communities.

It was during his time at Dunwoody that Augustine's most beautiful chapter began - he met the love of his life, Sarah Ann, who was also a student there. The two began a journey together that became the foundation of the Sere family. A lifelong learner, Augustine returned to Dunwoody, where he earned a Bachelor of Science in Construction Management in 2011.

A devout Christian, Augustine lived a life rooted in faith, humility, and service. He was a man of prayer, principle, and purpose, leading his family with spiritual conviction, deep love, and always calling for peace and unity. Professionally and personally, he was a builder - of roads, communities, and most importantly, of people.

He lived a life of quiet strength and deep wisdom, leaving behind a legacy of integrity, generosity, and unwavering devotion to God and family. His memory remains a guiding light for those he loved.
