“ As a broadcasting student at Northwestern College in the late 1970's, Brad worked overnight at KTIS. While working late night on broadcasting assignments in the KTIS basement, we students would sneak upstairs to watch Brad work - and he accommodated us.

Brad left KTIS, but came back when NWC Radio started Skylight. By 1986, I worked at missionary station KCAM in Alaska, the first non-NWC station on Skylight. Due to the time difference, Brad's program started at 8 pm - a local favorite. I occasionally called Brad with feedback about his Alaskan audience, and he once interviewed me on-air.

My last radio job was at NWC's Fargo station, while attending engineering school. As a fellow NWC Radio employee, I would talk to him occasionally.

About when Brad left KTIS again, I was hired by a Twin Cities engineering firm. One day, out the window I noticed Brad visiting the office next door! I invited him to tour my new employment.

Occasionally we heard Brad on WCCO. Later, we moved to Rochester, MN, found Brad on-air at KNXR! Brad let me to visit him there. That was the last time I talked to Brad - about ten years ago.

I appreciate the mentoring advice Brad gave me as a students, when he had no obligation. Over the years, I was blessed with an intersecting professional relationship with Brad. Even after I left broadcasting, Brad was warm to me. His friendship meant a lot to me, and I will miss Brad.
