He was diagnosed with Type II Diabetes before Samantha was born. As it progressed over the next 22 years, Brad endured multiple amputations, renal kidney failure putting him on dialysis and heart failure. He battled through these diseases with strength and courage and did it all for his daughter.

Brad thankfully was strong and well enough to be able to bring his daughter down the aisle on her wedding day and stand for their father-daughter dance. He was so proud of the woman she has grown to be.

Some of the many talents Brad is known for are his cooking skills, involving grilling various meats, dehydrating the best beef jerky, making homemade pizzas, and always finding the time to make his dad's hotdish. He was skilled with a pencil and paintbrush and loved creating artwork for his friends and family. He had a soft spot in his heart for nature and animals. Brad loved taking pictures of flowers, birds, and his favorite chipmunks, but anyone that knew dad knows how he feels about squirrels. He enjoyed making the outside of his home look beautiful. He tended to his flower gardens and always took pride in mowing the lawn. His love of nature brought him to many lakes to fish. Brad looked forward to his annual fishing trip to Tip Top Resort with all the men in the family. He also did an annual trip to his brother, Jeff's cabin for a Brother's Grimm weekend.

Family was always so important to Brad. Moline's are known for their multiple hour phone calls and long goodbyes. Family reunions and holidays were his

favorites because his musically inclined siblings would play guitar and sing their favorite songs. He belonged to his church family at CrossPoint as well. He accepted a relationship with Christ and went through life transformation before passing. He will be deeply missed by all who knew him.
