



## Carol Mae Lind

May 17, 1933 - February 16, 2025

Lind, Carol Mae (Roberg)

Age 91, of Minneapolis, passed away peacefully on Feb. 16. Preceded in death by husband of 59 years, James H. Lind. Survived by daughters Barbro (Peter) Koeleman and Roberta (David) Worrell; grandsons Thomas and Daniel Worrell; sister Judy (Ron) Vroom; niece Molly (Scott) Baker; in-laws Robert (Audrey) Lind and Sharon (Terry) Moriarity; nieces and nephews. Carol was born on May 17, 1933 to Olof and Agnes Roberg and grew up in Canyon, MN. In 1955, she graduated from Gustavus Adolphus College, with a B.A. in Home Economics. After graduation, Carol taught junior high home economics, and in 1958 married Jim. While raising their daughters, Carol was elected to serve on the Minneapolis Public Schools Board (1974-1980), during which time she also was appointed by then U.S. secretary of agriculture to a three-year term on the National Advisory Council on Child Nutrition. Throughout her life, she enjoyed sewing, gardening, and other creative endeavors. She was active in Home Economics in Homemaking and the League of Women Voters. Carol encouraged women to "Make Policy, Not Coffee." Memorials preferred to Eastside Meals on Wheels or donor's choice. Private interment will be held at a later date. A memorial service (also livestreamed) will be held Friday, Feb. 28 at 11 AM with visitation one hour prior at Washburn-McReavy Hillside Chapel, 2610 19th Ave NE, Minneapolis.
