David Keith Anderson was a Christmas baby, born in 1942 to Warren and Helen Anderson. His passion for baseball started as a young kid playing little league and watching the Detroit Tigers. He had a love for cars and trouble making in high school before going off to college at Montana State University where he studied architecture. He married Judy Wolverton with whom he had two sons, Tim and Rick Anderson. He later married Melissa Serold and had a third son, Ryan. After graduating from Montana State, he moved to Minnesota where he became a Twins and Vikings fan for the rest of his life. He worked with Ellerbee, SuperValu, and other companies in the commercial construction business for about 50 years building grocery stores, motels, and auto part stores. He lived in the Pittsburgh area for about two dozen years before returning to Minnesota to be near family in 2022. Sports and fitness were constant. Baseball was a lifelong passion as a player, little league coach, and fan. David ran many marathons over the years and was proud to have run the Boston marathon. He is survived by his sons Tim and Rick, daughter in-laws Carrie and Brenda, and grandchildren Jordan, Justin, Trent, and Paige. He passed peacefully on October 23rd, 2024, surrounded by family.

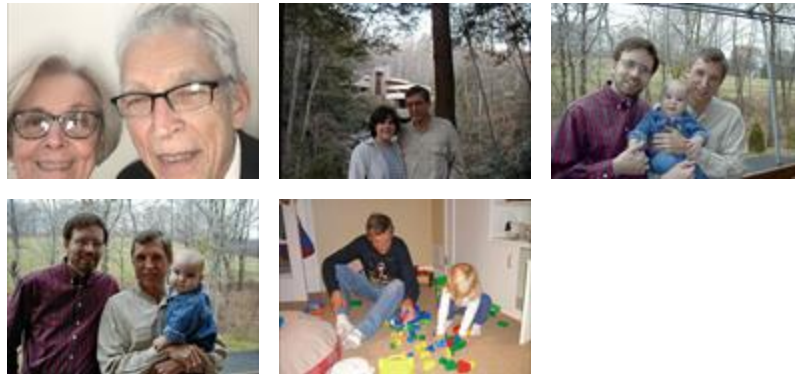
