David Ray Jorgensen, 77, of Brooklyn Center, MN died on June 16, 2024, surrounded by family, after a long, hard fought battle with cancer. David was born on February 18, 1947, in Luck, WI to Melvin and Irene (Larson) Jorgensen. He was the oldest of five children.

David attended Luck schools and graduated from Luck High School in 1965. While in high school David was an active member of St. Peter's Church, 4H and FFA. He also worked for Polk County Highway Department, the local gas station, Stokley's vegetable factory and the Duncan Yo-yo factory. He also was always busy helping on neighboring farms.

After graduating high school, David attended the University of Wisconsin, Eau Claire, and graduated in 1969 with a Bachelor of Science in Accounting and Economics. While studying at Eau Claire, David met his future bride, Donna in 1967. After graduating they were married on December 27, 1969, at First United Methodist Church in Rhinelander, WI.

After they were married, they moved to Hutchinson, MN for a short time, before moving to Roseville, where both of their children, John and Susan, were born. In 1977 they settled into Brooklyn Center where they have lived ever since, enjoying the triumphs and joys that come with a growing family. They found great success in the love and cherished memories they created as

a family.

After college, David went to work for the MN Department of Revenue. He was a caring and dedicated employee and worked with the MN Department of Revenue for 44 years before retiring in 2013. He was well respected at work and was honored with the Lighthouse Leadership Award in 2007 for leading by example, motivating co-workers and for always being available as a resource person.

David enjoyed traveling with his family, most recently having gone to Florida. His travels included Spain, Alaska and Hawaii, many trips to Mexico and many other adventures. He enjoyed numerous winter trips to Sanibel Island, for quiet family time on the beach. But for David, nothing compared to being at home or the cottage with his family.

David had many interests, but nothing was as important to him as family. He was a loving husband, caring father and a doting grandfather who lived to see his grandchildren laugh and smile. He glowed with pride at their accomplishments and rarely missed a concert, game or awards night. He truly loved nothing more than to be surrounded by his family.

He enjoyed daily games of cribbage with Donna always as his teammate. He loved the summer months when he could spend time at the cottage making fires, going on boat rides and watching his grandchildren catch fish from the dock. Summer months also welcomed his love for gardening. He enjoyed a good dad joke and would laugh at any pun, especially when told by his favorite grandson. He was always willing to lend a hand to anyone who asked, and there was never an errand he wouldn't run for you.

David was caring and compassionate. He always had a kind word for everyone. He was loved immensely and loved all those around him. His sense of humor and love of life will be forever missed by all.

David is survived by his loving wife of nearly 55 years, Donna, his son John, his daughter Susan (Luis) and his grandchildren Luis Enrique, Jhoseline, Daniel and Catherine and his great granddaughter Ruby. He is also survived by his siblings, Barbara Jorgensen, Faye Kamrath (Jeff) and Dennis Jorgensen as well as many nieces and nephews, cousins, family and friends.

He was preceded in death by his parents Melvin and Irene Jorgensen, and his younger brother Mark Jorgensen.
