Nasby, David Asher 78, passed away on November 5, 2017. He was a graduate St. Olaf College ('63), Luther Seminary ('66), and served as a Peace Corps volunteer in the Philippines. In his early professional life, he was a youth minister at Advent Lutheran Church and the Executive Director of The City Inc. on Lake Street. He retired in 2004 from General Mills after 25 years as the Director of Community Affairs and the Vice President of the General Mills Foundation. He was the Chair of the Board of Luther Seminary, and received St. Olaf College's Distinguished Alumni Award and Second Harvest Heartland Honors Hunger Hero Award. Through his vocation, he strove to combat the injustices of hunger, gender-inequality, and racial prejudice. He was committed to his family, the Lutheran faith, civil rights, and peace. He was a member of Trinity Lutheran Church in Hovland, MN. He is preceded in death by his parents, Rev. Gordon and Constance; sister, Carol Kaehler; and brother-in-law, Timothy Maland. He is survived by his wife of 55 years, Karen (Lillehaugen); children Teodoro (Malay) and Sergia Hay (Todd); grandchildren, Guyumani, Ashley, Aurland, and Eva; sisters, Mary Lohre (John) and Elizabeth Maland.
