David V. Peterson, age 84, of Mpls. Born in Evanston, IL on Nov. 25, 1917, died Aug. 2, 2002. Preceded in death by parents; siblings and life partner, Richard E. Heiny. Survived by niece and 2 nephews, 5 grand-nieces and nephews, and a huge family of friends and his beloved Tuppa. David was a Staff Sergeant in the Navy during WWII and stationed in Hawaii, where, because of his artistic talents, he served as Cartographer drawing island maps used by the U.S. forces. David started his interior design career in Omaha and in 1949 moved to Mpls, where he became one of the leading designers at Levoy's. Later he joined the firm of Hanson-Heiny as a designer. David was a long-time member of St. Mark's Episcopal Cathedral and was named a Living Treasure of the Church. He designed the sanctuary and altar rail needlepoint kneelers, as well as the cushions and reredos of the Apostle Creed in the All Saints Chapel. He was responsible for the library and served on many committees. He served as usher and was a member of Property Committee, House Committee, Memorial Committee, Stained Glass Committee, and the Altar Guild. Also in charge of renovation and redesign of the Fireplace Room. David's great joys were needlepointing and watercoloring, and was an accomplished artist in both.
