Shawbold Dean Shawbold, age 89, a 50-year White Bear Lake resident, graduated from the U of M College of Education with a master's degree in administrative education. He was captain of the University gymnastic team and a Big Ten Champion on the parallel bars in 1936-37. Dean taught physical education in the U.S. Navy, and Minneapolis schools; Ascension Catholic Elementary, Lincoln Jr. H.S., and Marshall University H.S. He also coached Marshall's gym team, swim team and tennis team. Dean was assistant and principal of Phillips Jr. H.S., assistant and principal of South H.S., and principal of Sanford Jr. H.S. He was instrumental in the planning of the new South High and the implementation of the new computer programmed modular scheduling. He was the last principal of the "old" South and the first principal of the "new" South High School. After retiring in 1976 from the Minneapolis School system, Dean devoted his time to community service. He was the last elected president of the Bellaire Community Club, commander of the White Bear Lake Legion Post 168, president of White Bear Lake AARP, and chairman of Senior Community Service. He will be missed by his loving wife of 17 years, Ellen Fredell Shawbold; son and daughter-in-law, Dean and Mary Shawbold, White Bear Lake; daughter and son-in-law, Shannon and Jim Foster, White Bear Lake; grandchildren, Michael and Kim Shawbold, Maplewood, Leesa Foster, Seattle and Sheri Hamerlind, TX; great-grandchildren, Ashley Hamerlind and Cody Shawbold; stepchildren, Steven and Jenene Fredell, Eagan, Bill and Kathy Fredell, Mpls, and Bob and Mary
