Passed away at Saint Therese at St. Odilia in Shoreview on February 16, 2018. Preceded in death by his wife of 61 years, Cressie (nee Enderle); parents, Linus and Gena; and 4 siblings; Glen, Leonard, Irene Wolden, and Alice Johnson. Survived by daughters, Laura (Tom) DeBiaso, Teri Holberg, and Stacy (John) Solan; granddaughter, Amy (Sean) Meszaros; and great-granddaughters, Vera and Iris. Don graduated from Plummer High School in 1936, was drafted into the Army and served in both North Africa and Italy as Technical Sergeant 42nd Ordnance Battalion. He then attended the University of Minnesota graduating in 1950 with a degree in Mechanical Engineering. He first worked for the Twin Cities Arsenal. However the bulk of his working career 1960-1984 was spent at the University of Minnesota retiring as the Associate Director of Physical Plant. On retirement he spent two summers as an engineering consultant in Indonesia. Subsequently he became very active in the Masons. He was Mason of the Year in 1991. Master of Tussler Summit Lodge in 1995 and went on to become President of the Master and Wardens in St. Paul in 1996. He was active in the St. Paul Valley Scottish Rite, Damascus Commandery, 25 years of service to the St. Paul Osman Shrine, and as a guide at the Shriner's Hospitals for Children. He loved to travel and spent much time overseas. He was a member of VFW

and was privileged to join the WWII Veteran's Honor Flight in 2012.
