Liz, as she preferred to be called, began her schooling in a one-room schoolhouse and boarded to complete Crystal High School where she starred as a basketball player. Liz was graduated from Mayville State Teachers' College where she met her husband of 54 years, Roy Anderson. They had five children all of whom they supported through college. Elizabeth and Roy spent years working in schools and in support of children. Elizabeth was active in her church, community and neighborhood both before and following Roy's death in 1993. Her son, Dick, preceded her in death in 2003. Four children, Lynne, Judy, Gregg, and Mark, nine grandchildren, and nineteen great grandchildren survive and all will miss her greatly. Two sisters, Joyce (Gee) and Donna (Rutford); brother, Albert Shephard also survive her.
