Betty loved spending time with family and friends. We watched captioned movies at friends houses long before there were captions on TV. Socializing at the Charles Thompson Memorial Hall (the Deaf Club) was another favorite activity. She also made yearly trips to South Dakota to visit family and friends. She was also very involved in her Church, enjoyed singing in the choir, wrote newsletters for several organizations and served as a secretary. After retiring she volunteered with hospice and loved to visit shut-ins at their home or in care centers. Her great grandchildren brought her much joy in her last few years.

She will be deeply missed by her friends and family including many nieces, nephews and their families. In lieu of flowers memorials preferred to the
