His love was unconditional. He consistently used gentle patience and delighted all with his clever humor and playful teasing. He was a loyal Super Fan especially for the Gustie's (Gustavus Adolphus) women's hockey team and his granddaughter athletes. Many were amused by his talented jerry rigging of cars, boat motors, household devices, most anything needing fixing. He preferred shopping for bargains at Goodwill yet was generous with his family. George is treasured by a host of friends and acquaintances. Some said he was a second father.

George taught math and science at Centennial High School, coached football and wrestling, and worked hard for thirteen years negotiating salaries for his colleagues. He served as chair of his church's parish council and spent many years working on the church's first communion program. Golf and travelling cross country on his Gold Wing with his wife were his passions. His students respected him. He established firm boundaries, always with respect. Many said they would not have learned math if not for him. George's leave-taking has left a gaping hole. He will be sorely missed.
