“Wow! I went to "Momie Larson's Kindergarten In Kingston, NH when I was 4 years old in 1967. So sorry to hear of her passing. I wish I could have seen her again.

*I remember her teaching me to write my name, making jelly in her kitchen. I remember the swings out in front of the house. My desk (table/bench?) was by a window where i could see the swings (I think?) My mom told me a story when I was grown up about one of my older brothers that also started there when he was 4. She said he cried everyday and Momie Larson would have to call her to come pick him up early. After a couple of weeks of this, Momie Larson said to my mom "I think maybe Larry isn't quite ready for this". What a patient woman she must have been! She was right, and my brother went back the next year when he was 5.*

*Because it was a private kindergarten, I was able to go when I was 4 (I wouldn't turn 5 until November). My family then moved to Maine when I was 6 years old. I ended up graduating a year earlier than I should have if I had gone to a public kindergarten. I feel like,....if it wasn't for "Momie Larson" and her patience,....I would be a year behind in my life!! So sorry she is gone! :( I wish I had some photos, but i don't. :(*
