The family of Gregory Alonzo Weed is saddened to announce his passing on June 5, 2020 at the age of 75.

Gregory Alonzo Weed was born to Emery Gilbert “Duke” Weed and Mable “Bo” Frances (Mitchell) Weed August 15, 1944 in Sacramento, California. He was third of four children and was raised in the picturesque small California town of Ferndale. He attended Ferndale High School, graduating with the class of 1962 as its student body president. Gregg was a gifted athlete participating in football, basketball and track. He enlisted in the United States Air Force in July 1965. He proudly served his country as a radio operator during the Vietnam War. He returned to the United States and was honorably discharged from service in September 1968. Gregg married the love of his life, Pamela Nielson, in their hometown of Ferndale, California August 16, 1969. Gregg began his professional career in banking at Bank of America and continued in various positions with commercial lending organizations in California, Oregon and Washington State. Gregg and Pam raised two boys, Tim and James, in California before moving to Spokane, Washington in the early 1990’s. After Pam’s death in 2019, Gregg moved closer to his son,

James, in Minnesota where he enjoyed many activities at his senior apartment complex, including cards, dancing and bingo. He noted in his journal that he accepted Christ in 2020. Gregg loved fly fishing and hunting, watching movies and sports and always enjoyed a great meal with a fine glass of wine.

Gregg will be missed by his children, Tim (Joy), James (Kim); grandchildren, Alex, Ethan, Mackenzie, Dawson, and Ashley; sister Jaci (Carl) Distefano; brother Ben (Nina); as well as numerous extended family and friends.

Gregg was preceded in death by his loving wife of almost 50 years, Pam; brother, Emery; and parents, Emery and Mable.

Gregg will be laid to rest at Western Montana Veterans Cemetery in Missoula, Montana with full military honors.
