



Harold Floyd Griffiths

December 22, 1926 - February 13, 2021

Harold Floyd Griffiths died peacefully at home, surrounded by family, on Saturday, February 13th at 3:36 PM in Plymouth, Minnesota. Where to begin. Of course, yes, he was a father, grandfather, husband, and brother, loved dearly, and looked up to by countless many. Harold was also a clever and savvy businessman, philanthropist, and honored member of the Merchant Marines.

In his blessed 94 years, Harold lived many lives. Born December 22nd, 1926 in Mankato, Minnesota to Erma and John Roy Griffiths, Harold began his tenure with the Merchant Marines at the young age of 17, hauling oil around the world, and eventually transporting prisoners of war between Germany and the United States during World War II. His family had the pleasure of being regaled by countless stories of driving 600 foot tankers and adventures from his travels around the world.

One story they recount, "When Grandpa was Master of the Panamanian flag tanker, MS J.A. Mowinckel, he told how they were torpedoed by a German U-boat on one trip. Grandpa was able to steer the tanker to safety from torpedoes, but when pulling in to what they thought was a safe inlet, the ship hit a U.S. mine. Out of fear of being attacked again, Grandpa ordered the ship to be abandoned. The ship was later towed to safety and repaired to be used in service again."

After the Merchant Marines, Harold was drafted into service with the U.S. Army in 1950. After being honorably discharged as PFC 1st Class in 1952, he returned home to Eden Prairie, Minnesota.

Harold's next adventure, and now a great part of his legacy, was driving the success of Wrico Stamping Co. Becoming the principal owner in 1966, Harold took the 2,000 square foot building, and 2 employees, and helped Wrico/K-Tek grow to 8 locations, employing over 600 people, many of which have stayed with Wrico for decades. Employees would often see Harold walking around the press floor to chat and joke around with them.

Beyond the empire he helped create through Wrico/K-Tek, Harold was a philanthropist and held a strong belief in giving back. Although never formally educated beyond high school, Harold held a great respect for the young mind, and started two foundations to help others reach their college goals. Harold is known in the Eden Prairie and Motley communities for providing scholarships to students in order for them to go to college.

Harold Griffiths, known by his family as being a jokester and storyteller, is preceded in death by first wife Betty Holasek Griffiths, who died from cancer in 1989, his 3-year-old brother Roger; four sisters: Dorothy, Iva, Norma, and Belva; and step-son Keith Nord.

Harold is survived by second wife Virginia Nord Griffiths (married in 1991), two brothers: Orvil and Harlyn, two children from Betty: Kenneth Griffiths (Kathy) and Keith Griffiths (Fiancé Ann Bouchard); six grandchildren and five great-grandchildren: Nathan Griffiths, Briana Anders (Husband Patrick, and children Emery, Cora, and Desmond), Kyle Griffiths, Cecelia Pallotto (Husband Luke and children Remington and Adela), Luke Otto-Griffiths, and Kylie Griffiths.

Blessed to find love a second time, and humbled to reciprocate the love from the family Virginia shared with her first husband Lynn Nord (died from cancer in 1987), Harold is also survived by two step-daughters: Cheryl Hook (Jan), Kimberly Nord-Nash (Gregory); daughter-in-law Jennifer Nord (Keith Nord); eight grandchildren and four great-grandchildren: Joshua Hook (Wife Jennifer and daughter Autumn), Lauren Maben (Husband Andrew), Gretchen Nash, Kathryn Dougherty (Husband Michael and children Alexander and Kaiden), Alexandra Yonga (Husband Joseph and son Remy), Emerson Sankey, Easton Sankey, and Avery Nord.
