Battles: Sou Philippines (Liberaton) Luzon (US invades Luzon in the Philippines January 9, 1945). Decorations: PURPLE HEART GO#103 45 HQ 11th AB Div., Asiatic-Pacific Theater Service Medal, Philippine Liberation Service Ribbon, Good Conduct Medal and Distinguished Unit Badge GO#68. After WWII he worked for Don Pederson, Dawson, MN and in 1959, NSP, Edina, MN - retired in 1987. A very proud WWII Veteran.
