Trolander, Harriett Dawn Born in Faribault County Minnesota March 4, 1910; died May 10, 2006. Harriett, 96, was the second child of eight born to Albert and Louise Woolery. They moved to Dunn Center, North Dakota when Harriett was a young child and lived there until she was 16 when the family moved to Montevideo, Minnesota. After graduation from Montevideo High School, she worked as a teacher's helper for a year. Harriett earned a two-year teaching degree from St. Cloud State and taught school in a number of one-room schools over a five year period. In 1937 she married Everett W. Trolander and moved to Minneapolis. They were married for over 64 years. Harriett was active in PTA, League of Women voters, and Walker Methodist Church. She worked part-time at Dayton's in the needlecraft area and taught knitting classes. Her great interest and hobby was knitting. An expert, she was able to knit hundreds of clothing items from mittens and caps to dresses and two-piece outfits. Harriet is survived by her two children, Judy in Duluth, John (Maxine) in Oronoco, Minnesota; one grandson, Brian in Minneapolis; and two brothers, Charles (Norma) Woolery of Bella Vista, Arkansas and Donald Woolery of Bowie, Maryland; and two sisters, Janet Gunter of Clara City and Marge Ross of Blackduck.
