“ I'm sorry to be almost 9 years late with this. I worked for Harry as a truck driver from September of 1974 through December of 1976. My description of Harry is that he was a shrewd operator with a big heart. He should have flunked me on my test drive because I didn't know how to shift the old Mack Triplex transmission. Half way through he had to switch places with me and drive back to the yard. This was to keep me from ruining the transmission and teach me how to use it. He hired me anyway!

During one brief run from Minneapolis to the Preferred Products warehouse outside Chaska I managed to overturn the rig with a load of brown sugar after two sharp turns just a quarter mile from the destination. It felt really weird sitting in the truck cab as it rested on its side in the road. I just knew that would be my last run for Harry. But to my utter shock and amazement, his reaction was first to get me checked out by a doctor. When it turned out that I was OK, Harry said "when you fall off a horse the best thing to do is get back on and ride him again." Two days later I left on my regular run to Anniston, Alabama.

I did several other dumb things while working for Harry, but he and his son Jerry were always there to bail me out. Harry and his entire family came to my wedding to Paula Hartmann in Waconia, Minnesota on August 29, 1975 and gave us a very generous gift.

I went on to have a successful career in transportation and logistics, finally retiring in 2014 after selling my business in Olathe, Kansas. Although it is now so late, I send my sincere thanks to Harry and my heartfelt condolences and best wishes to Jerry and the rest of Harry's family.
