



## Harry Rustad

Rustad Harry Robert, age 81, of Mpls, formerly of Brooklyn Center, MN, and survivor of the D-Day Normandy Invasion of World War Two, passed peacefully into the Lord's home Wednesday evening, October 29, 2003, after succumbing to complications from a long illness. Harry was born May 21, 1922 in Enderlin, North Dakota. He enlisted in the U.S. Army in 1942 as a field lineman with the 56th Signal Battalion, 1st Infantry Division, and saw combat in Europe. While stationed in Germany after the war, he met and married Mabel, his first wife. Upon returning to America, Harry received an Honorable Discharge from the Army, and was later employed by Bethlehem Steel Co., and after many years, he retired. Harry has joined in death his parents, Robert and Gertrude; granddaughter, Katherine Louise Kirkhuff, and past wives, Mabel Elisabeth Wolf, Doris Lillian Gouin, Harriet Elaine Joelson. He is survived by his daughters, Evelyn Brett-Bishop (Larry), Rhonda Nordquist (Terrance); granddaughters, Anna and Crystal Nordquist; stepdaughter, Shirley McChesney (Jack); many nieces, nephews and friends, here and in Germany.
