When we first met we found it interesting that he was born in Melrose and I spent my first 17 years nearby graduating from Melrose High School in 1954. Upon graduation, I enlisted in the USAF and, like Lary, completed my basic training at Lackland AFB in San Antonio. One of the things I did during my years here at Applewood was edit our monthly Newsletter for five years. In the April 2020 issue I featured Lary and most of that article follows.

Have you ever thought about what our Applewood Pointe would be like if Lary and Carol Haupt had not moved into unit 406 on Aug. 31, 2004? I have! A frequent question posed to him is, Why^[L]_[SEP] do you use only one “r” in Lary? The answer is because it was derived from his given name, Hilary. Since the day he moved in, my guess is, he has worked for us an average of two hours per day, twenty-four seven. He is a perfectionist and has been struggling lately with health issues that make him realize that he cannot continue to do many of the things he has done for us over the past 15 plus years.

These are some of the things Lary does, has done, and in many cases, continues to do for us:

Ran for the first Board, got elected and served as the first President of the Board. He served three terms since, and recently resigned due to health problems.

Personally did security checks for two years before asking for help. Then he developed a nightly schedule.

Tested the hot tub, when we had one, on weekends and days when the maintenance man was not working. Answered calls day and night regarding smoke detectors and other alarms.

Found an alternate cable provider, Warner/ Sight & Surf, and supervised the installation of the necessary hardware. In 2017, he headed negotiations with Comcast for our present cable internet package.

Purchases, stores, and checks supplies for the Social Committee. This includes a shopping trip to Sam's Club for each grill night. He also makes many purchases for Applewood via the internet.

Designed and made a name tag for every person who has been or is a resident of our Applewood Pointe. That number is now 285 and counting.

Designs and produces professional looking signage for posting throughout our building.

Designed and produced our first picture directory and made several updates since.

Finds and coordinates activities monthly for our Veterans group. Also produced a vets picture directory and subsequent updates.

Solves computer, internet and almost any electronic problem for residents on a daily basis.

Is frequently called upon for his vast knowledge of what has been done in the past, what needs to be done and where things are in our building with respect to maintenance.

Set up the computer in the library and designed and taught classes on the use of a PC computer.

Among Lary's good attributes is his ability to remain calm, cool, and collected in the most tense, controversial situations. He has made a big footprint at our home. Next time you see him, thank him for his service as a member of the USAF and a member of Applewood Pointe of Roseville.

Lary has left a large foot print on our home and, obviously, will be deeply missed. Like many others, I am a better person because of the time I was fortunate to live and work him. John
