James H. McNulty, Age 90, of St. Anthony, passed away April 9, 2016, at the Benedictine Health Center at Innsbruck in New Brighton, MN. Jim was born April 14, 1925, grew up in NE Minneapolis, attended Thomas Lowry Elementary and Edison High School. At Edison Jim met his wife Evelyn. They were married for 68 wonderful years.

Jim was a 28 year employee of Honeywell, Inc., working in Production Control at the Twin City Army and Ammunition Plant in New Brighton. Jim proudly served in the United States Navy and was Honorably Discharged in 1945. It was during his time in the Navy that Jim was able to appear on camera in the World War II movie, "The Fighting Seabees" with John Wayne, Susan Hayward, and Dennis O'Keefe. He was also very active serving in the community in which he lived. Jim was the former Mayor of the City of St. Anthony from 1963-1965, Council Member and served as a volunteer Fireman. As a devout Catholic, Jim was a past President of the St. Charles Pastoral Council.

Jim loved working with young people. He volunteered as a football coach and Little League baseball coach with the St. Anthony Sports Boosters program. Later, was an American Legion baseball coach to many of the young people who grew up in St. Anthony in the 1960s and 1970s.

Jim was preceded in death by his parents, Alma and James Sr.; and two sisters, Helen and Margaret. Jim is survived by his wife, Evelyn; brother, Thomas (Jean); sons, Kevin (Eve) and Daniel (Theresa); daughter, Kathleen McNulty (Jeff); and three grandchildren, Kaitlyn, Erin, and Henley.
