Dahlberg, Jerome E. age 88, of New Hope, passed away unexpectedly on 3/13/23. Jerry, as friends and family knew him, graduated from Roosevelt High School and went on to serve four years in the US Air Force and earn bachelor's degrees in general and elementary education respectively from the University of Omaha and the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities, as well as a master's degree in educational administration from UMN. Jerry spent his entire career of almost 35 years as an elementary school educator with St. Louis Park Public Schools, first teaching 6th grade, then moving to media generalist. He also spent one year working abroad in Australia as part of a teacher exchange program. Jerry enjoyed many passions including reading, gardening and other yardwork, traveling/camping, nature (birdwatching, in particular), square dancing, woodworking, fixing/repairing things, creating stained glass art, volunteering, telling stories about his childhood and young adulthood, and especially going to the cabin. He was a devoted, loving, and patient husband, father, and grandfather and loyal supporter of his kids' and grandkids' interests and activities. Preceded in death by wife, Marilyn, parents, a brother, and two half-sisters. Survived by son, Eric (Suzanne); daughter, Heidi Wojahn; grandchildren, Braden, Madeline, Heather, and Justina.
