Longtime resident and former mayor of St. Anthony Village passed away on Monday, December 15, 2025 at the age of 79.

He is survived by his wife Diane; son Ron (Jacqui) Faust; step-son Wayde (Jennifer) Stallmann; siblings Carol Kummer, Bob (Pat) Faust, Mary Faust & many nieces, nephews other family & many friends.

He is preceded in death by parents & sister Rose Juneau.

He had a 22 year military career (10 1/2 years active duty) with the US Army; 2 years foreign service, in both Korea & Vietnam; he was a Master Army Aviator and commanded an Aviation Battalion, and a Mechanized Infantry Company, retiring as a Lt. Colonel.

A memorial celebration of Jerome's life will be held on Sunday, May 31st from 1-4 PM at Silverwood Park - Great Hall, 2500 County Rd E, St. Anthony Village. Interment with military honors will be held at Ft. Snelling National Cemetery on Monday, June 1st, 10:30 AM.
