Jon Arthur Skrivseth, 65, died unexpectedly. A long time resident of Bloomington, MN, Jon was a British mystery and 60's enthusiast. He used to say the first people he hoped to see after passing were John Lennon, Sir Conan Doyle and Agatha Christie. He graduated from Lincoln High School in Bloomington in 1975 and after trying to relocate in California he experienced his first earthquake and came back to Bloomington to stay. He will be remembered for his humor and quick wit.

Survived by his brother Robert (Mary) Skrivseth, sisters Karen (Stephen) Notsch and Lisa (Ray) Rabbitt. Also survived by his nephews William (Kaitlyn) Monteith, Timothy Skrivseth and Kenneth Skrivseth and niece Shannon (Greg) Blasi and a special grandnephew Rhys as well as many other friends and family.
