Josh was a brother who loved and protected his siblings with the ferocity of a fighter and the heart of a saint. Always ready to make them laugh,

but even quicker to meet their needs and solve their problems. As a son, Josh loved his parents deeply and reflected the best of each of them: the diligence and love of his mother; the patience, compassion, and fight of his father. In recent years, Josh cultivated a life of faith in Jesus. Though this was usually a private matter for him, his faith was a source of deep comfort and guidance through difficult times. He was a regular attendee of Hometown Church in Bloomington and was impacted by the teachings of Andy Stanley at Northpoint Community Church. Because of this, we take comfort in Revelation 21:4: "He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away."
