She was active in: Bible studies, choir, serving homeless, prayer groups and all kinds of committees. Joyce loved to travel and instilled that into her children. She saw Europe, Mexico (parasailed at age 74!), Hawaii, Belize (mission trip, age 76), Israel (with her church, age 78). She loved visiting family and friends across the county. She traveled to Colorado, age 90, for grandsons HS graduation and was so proud to be there. She started every day with daily devotion and prayer time where she would remember all her family and those in need. She

was an avid bridge player and swam daily. Joyce finished her earthly walk enjoying time at Presbyterian Homes, in Bloomington, MN. She was a longtime resident and was known by all as an ambassador. She would walk the entire complex delivering bulletins and stop and greet each person she met. She was loved by many. She is survived by Eric (Bette Anne) Sorenson, Julie (Dave) Engel, Peter Sorenson, Meta (Mike) Van Skiver. She is also survived by 6 stepchildren: Sheldon (Roian) Rettmann, Melanie Clark, Leon (Carol) Rettmann, Lisa Irving, David Rettmann, Robert (Nancy) Rettmann. She had many grandchildren and great grandchildren, whom she adored!
