



Judith Anne (Tingerthal) Ervin

March 25, 1945 - April 19, 2015

Died on April 19, at age 70, from complications of Alzheimer's Disease. Born in St. Paul, she was a member of the first class to attend all four years at St. Bernard's High School; she was a proud business major at the College of St. Catherine; and she earned her Masters of Business Administration at New York University. Judy spent her career in New York City, primarily working for Citicorp where she retired as a vice-president in 2007. She travelled widely, enjoyed the cultural life of New York, and skied in Europe, New England, and the western US. After retiring, Judy became an enthusiastic volunteer for the Central Park Conservancy, an activity she continued well after her health started to decline. The increasing effects of her Alzheimer's caused her to leave her beloved New York condo and move closer to her family in the Twin Cities, where she died in Edina. She was preceded in death by her parents, William and Anne (Deutsch) Tingerthal and a brother, Fr. James Tingerthal, OSB. She is survived by brothers and sisters, William Tingerthal (Eldean), Robert Tingerthal (Lenore), Margaret Prokosch (Thomas) and Mary Tingerthal (Conrad Soderholm), her friend, Pam Zagaria, her twelve nieces and nephews, 21 grand nieces and nephews, and cousins and friends around the world. Her beloved caregivers from Beehive Homes and the NC Little Hospice made it possible for her to live well and then die peacefully. A funeral service is planned for Friday, April 24 at 7:30 p.m. and preceded by visitation from 6:00 to 7:30 pm at SAINT FRANCES CABRINI CATHOLIC CHURCH at 1500 Franklin Ave SE in Minneapolis. Burial will be at the Saint John's Abbey
