“ Mom,

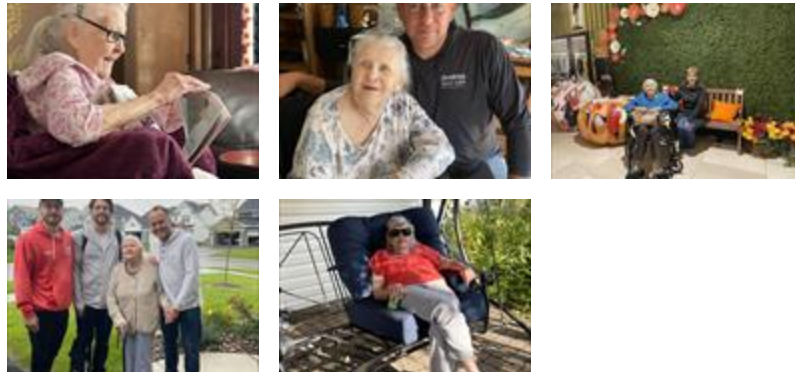
