people than listed. Her work as a Ramsey County social worker was another way to help people, and her colleagues there became lifelong friends. Kathy was always the loudest fan in the crowd, cheering for her kids, grandkids, and sometimes their opponents by mistake! She rarely missed an event that was important to them. We will miss so much about her, and our loss is great, but our overwhelming emotion is gratitude for the gift we were given in knowing and loving Kathy.
