



Laura May (Davidson) Hueller

January 16, 1920 - July 6, 2009

Age 89, of St. Paul, passed away on July 6, 2009. Preceded in death by husband, William (2002). Survived by sisters, Mary Pruitt and Barbara Dingle; daughters, Ann Hueller and Mary Guyer; sons, David and Peter (Diane); and grandchildren, Molly Hueller, Jon Guyer, Andy (Debbie) Hueller, Patrick Hueller, and Ann Guyer. Laura was born January 16, 1920, in Chatfield, MN. She graduated valedictorian from Chatfield High School in 1938 and from Macalester College (St. Paul) in 1942 with degrees in history and education. She married William on January 4, 1943. Bill and Laura were active in Presbyterian Church life; they ran the Gingerbread House Bakery together until Laura began teaching deaf/hard-of-hearing children thru the St. Paul public schools (1966 - 1985). She led Campfire Girl groups including the first group for deaf/hard-of-hearing girls in MN and helped launch summer camps for deaf children. She was active in precinct-level politics, a volunteer gardener at Como Park Conservatory, and a 10-year volunteer at Lyngblomsten Senior Care Center. Memorial service 11 AM Saturday, July 18 at WARRENDALE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH, 1040 Como Ave., St. Paul with visitation beginning at 9:30 AM. Interment was held at Ft. Snelling.
