He fulfilled his active duty requirements by serving first at Lakehurst, NJ on the blimp squadron, and then on the aircraft carrier, Kittyhawk. After graduating from the U of M, he began working for Hennepin County Social Services as a caseworker. He remained at the county for his entire professional career, and served in many capacities, finally retiring as a Social Work supervisor in foster care.

Sports were always a primary interest for Larry. He enjoyed being on baseball or softball teams, but his ultimate joy was coaching his children and grandchildren or attending whatever sport they were playing. He was always eager to greet them after a competition and never failed to do so with, "You played a great game!" In his retirement years, being a BAJ (Born Again Jock), provided him with a whole new network of softball, volleyball, and bowling friends.

Larry's spiritual life was a primary part of who he was. A long time member of Redemption Lutheran in Bloomington, his servant heart was evident. He loved to have the opportunity to read scripture during services and served as deacon, usher, Stephen Minister and school board member over 30 plus years. His beautiful smile and bright blue eyes will be missed by many.
