Lee was proud to have started and managed this successful business for over 20 years. Lee was an honorable man, devoted to his family, and admired for his great integrity, warmth and wit. He enjoyed nature and was an avid reader, particularly of historical biographies. Lee was interested in staying fit and healthy, and loved outdoor activities. Of the many activities he enjoyed, running was number one. He ran nearly every day, participating in many races

including the Freedom Five 4th of July race in Siren, WI which was near his cabin in Danbury, WI. This annual event included the entire family with everyone gathering at the cabin to run this race with him every year, and one in which he often medaled. But what was most important to him was his family. Lee and Georgia had a long and happy marriage which was full of love, mutual admiration and respect - a wonderful legacy for their children and grandchildren. He loved all family gatherings and there were many. He loved his family deeply - and we loved him with all our hearts. We will miss him immensely.
