July 21, 1931 - December 3, 2020

Loretta Kramer Doering, age 89, of Crystal, MN, died peacefully after a stroke, surrounded by her children on Thursday, December 3, 2020. Loretta was born on July 21, 1931, in Wishek, ND, graduated from Wishek High School, and completed nurses' training at Mounds Midway School of Nursing in Minneapolis. She married her high school sweetheart, Bob Doering, and settled in Crystal, where they raised three children. Loretta worked as a dedicated nurse in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit at North Memorial Hospital for 40 years, where she blessed many families by helping to save the lives of prematurely born babies. She and Bob enjoyed taking the kids and grandkids on camping trips and weekends at the cabin. They thoroughly loved square dancing with Crystal Crosstrailers and Wandering Wheels. She was passionate about making sure that everyone had lots of good food to eat. Loretta was sociable and enjoyed keeping up with her many siblings and neighbors, even hosting sewing classes for the ladies in her neighborhood. She was a committed Christian and was active in her church. In her later years she suffered from dementia and moved into memory care. She was preceded in death by husband, Bob in 2017, and survived by sister, Jean "Alean" Kruger, three children and their families, Myra (Doug) Arnold, Diane (Tom) Ringdal, David (Linda) Doering, 8 grandchildren and 8 great-grandchildren.
