Luella Jane McInerny, age 96, died from complications of a traumatic brain injury on February 22nd in Anoka. Married to her husband Roger for nearly 74 years, Lue raised their six children in a chaotically love-filled house on the East side of Richfield. Lue was an animal lover, sharing the Richfield home with her best friend, a mutt named Max, plus cats Freeway and Sweet Pea, and various tropical fish, lizards, mice, parakeets, and whatever else the kids dragged home. A devout Catholic, Lue was active in the choir at Assumption Catholic Church, as well as in the Roosevelt High School alumni choir. She was a competitive bowler with several area teams throughout her life, throwing strikes well into old age. She is also remembered as an excellent seamstress, always whipping up something amazing on her Singer for her kids, or grandkids, or great-grandkids. Lue was preceded in death by her beloved husband Roger; her son Roger McInerny, Jr.; and her siblings Peter, Donnie, Mari and Pat. She is survived by her living children, Paul, Genevieve, Vivian, Maurice and Joseph; as well as many grandchildren, great-grandchildren, nieces and nephews.
