Lynda was smart, spontaneous, lively, funny and could talk faster than anyone around her. She loved being a mother and radiated with joy of having her babies. Lynda was very active in the boys' schools, sports and other activities. The family also went on many camping and sightseeing trips all over the United States. Lynda returned to work when the boys were older, and worked as a secretary and officer manager. Her sons' families added a whole new dimension to her life and she really loved being a grandma. Lynda was diagnosed with early onset Alzheimer's disease in February of 1998 at the age of 53. She never dwelled on it very much and tried to live with it as best she could. Nick took care of Lynda at home until May 2004, when she moved to the Wellstead of Rogers. Her family is grateful to the staff of the Wellstead and North Memorial Hospice for their loving care.
