Lynette Cecile Lindmark (née Larson), age 82, passed away on Saturday, October 9, 2021, with her family by her side. She is survived by her husband of 59 years, Ronald; 2 children, son Eric (Julie) Lindmark and daughter Kirstin (Neil) Johnston; 4 grandchildren, Jacob and Grace Lindmark, Linnea and Liam Johnston; 2 sisters, Bonnie Lindquist (Don Eide) and Sonia (Paul) St. Clair; and many nieces and nephews.

Lynette was born on January 8, 1939, in Chicago, Illinois, to Sidney and Laura Larson. She spent her formative years in south Minneapolis, Minnesota, where she lived until graduating from Theodore Roosevelt High School in 1957. She received her Bachelor of Arts degree in Home Economics from the University of Minnesota (U of M) where she also met her husband, Ron because they were seated alphabetically in shared classes. They were married on December 16, 1961, while she was attending the U of M for her master's degree.

Soon after getting married, Ron took a job with the US Forest Service in Columbus, Ohio, where their son Eric was born. They relocated to Duluth, Minnesota, where their daughter, Kirstin was born. Ron's job took them to Carbondale, Illinois; South Ogden, Utah; Washington D.C.; and lastly to Arden Hills, Minnesota. During this period Lynette raised her children and provided a home for her family. She and Ron liked to travel, including accompanying Ron

on international work trips to Japan, Sweden, and Norway. They also were avid campers and camped throughout the United States during their 59 years together.

Lynette had many friends and was involved in numerous activities including being a founding member of the North Suburban New Neighbors Club, member of St. Paul Area New Residents' Club, bridge club, book clubs, and volunteering for Meals on Wheels. She also had many hobbies including sewing, knitting, crocheting, and a life-long passion for reading and watching British mysteries, which she has passed on to her children.

Lynette will be remembered for her love of family. She and Ron were actively involved in their children and grandchildren's lives and thankful to live close to them. Lynette babysat, attended concerts and school plays, sewed costumes, volunteered at their vacation bible school, and many other activities. She was a constant presence in their lives, and she will be greatly missed.

She is preceded in death by her parents. A memorial service followed by a reception will be held at 11 AM Saturday October 16th (visitation from 10-11 AM) at the Lutheran Church of the Resurrection 3115 Victoria St N, Roseville, MN, 55113 with Pastor Sarah Friesen-Carper presiding. Interment at 1 PM at Roselawn Cemetery 803 West Larpenteur Avenue, Roseville, MN 55113.
