



## Margaret Jones Perry Moore

Margaret Elizabeth Jones Perry Moore, age 94, of Minneapolis, MN, peacefully passed away Friday, October 25, 2002, in her home at the Jones Harrison Residence. She was born February 15, 1908, in Norfolk, VA, to Mabel Virginia Davis and Cleveland H. Jones. Capt. Jones was the founder of Jones Boat Yard on the Miami River, FL. Mabel was a well-known designer and dressmaker in the Norfolk community who died very young, leaving Margaret and her brother Vernon as small children. Margaret was predeceased by her husband and father of their three children, yacht Captain Charles C. Perry; her second husband, Boyd Moore; her son, Charles M.S. Perry; her brother, Vernon Jones; and her half brothers, Cleveland Jones Jr. and Frank Jones.
