Marion Jean (Yaeger) Glasow, the daughter of Erwin Yaeger and Vera (Matthews) Yaeger, was born December 25, 1930 in Springfield, Minnesota. She graduated from Sanborn High School in 1948 and then attended St. Olaf and Macalester colleges. After college, she taught for 5 years in the communities of Willmar, MN, Long Beach, Ca, and St Paul, MN. On September 17, 1955 Marion was united in marriage to Duane Glasow of Pine City, MN. When her children arrived (son Rick and daughter LeAnn) she was happy to spend the next few years as a stay-at-home mom. After Rick and LeAnn were grown, Marion spent several years employed as a home health aide. Upon retiring from this job, she spent many years volunteering at Lyngblomsten Care Center and Roseville Lutheran Church. Duane retired in 1981, which allowed the two of them to travel extensively and attend numerous elderhostels, with Hawaii being their favorite. In her later years, until her physical condition no longer allowed it, she spent her days working the daily crossword puzzle and reading the newspaper (cutting out and saving important articles to be shared with or mailed to others later!), corresponding with long-time friends and extended family, and keeping a detailed daily diary. Never was there a question as to what anyone in the family had been doing ten years ago....! Marion is survived by her son Richard Glasow of Blaine, MN, daughter LeAnn Hassinger of St Paul, MN; two granddaughters, two great grandsons, and her brother Robert Yaeger. She was preceded in death by her husband Duane Glasow and parents Erwin and Vera Yaeger. In lieu of
