Heggstad, Marjorie Elizabeth died November 8, 2020. She was born September 15, 1927, in Colby, Wisconsin, to William and Zoa (Fuller) Beawer, the eldest of five sisters. She married Wayne A. Heggstad, Feb. 11, 1955, at Hennepin Ave. United Methodist Church, Mpls. They were together 43 years, in Mpls., Detroit Lakes, Milwaukee, Wis., Manitowoc, Tomah, Omaha Nebr., and Bloomington, until Wayne's death in 1998. She was preceded in death by parents; sisters, Irene Miller, Ellen Zoa Beawer, and Alberta Grubbs; and grandson, John A. Survivors include children, Todd A. of Duluth, Ellen Mary of Eagan, and Ross W. (Elizabeth) of Shakopee; four grandchildren, Sarah, Benjamin, Ann, and Mary; great grandchildren, William, Henrik, Anders, Hudson; a sister, Alice Burnett of Spokane, Washington; many nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends. She attended Colby public schools, graduated from C.S.J.C. (now University of Wisconsin - Stevens Point), 1949, and Omaha University (now University of Nebraska - Omaha) with a M.S. degree, 1968. She taught jr. high school geography at Antigo, Wisconsin, social studies and english at Lincoln Jr. High, Mpls., tenth grade English at Tomah, Wis., and reading at Prior Lake Jr. H.S. She was a real estate agent with Frank Kreiser real estate, Harvey Hansen real estate and Edina Realty from 1981 until her retirement in about 2001. Mrs. Heggstad was a member of Hennepin Avenue United Methodist Church, the Society of Mayflower Descendants in Minnesota, of which she held positions of secretary and governor, and the Daughters of the American Revolution.
