Born and raised in Proctor, MN, he was a Navy veteran, a graduate of UMD and the U of M, and one unfinished paper away from his PhD. That title wasn't important to him. He was a longtime teacher. Most of his 37 years of teaching was at Columbia Heights High School, where he taught Physics and Math. He was a leader in the MN Senior Federation, and a warrior for property tax reform. He worked tirelessly in an attempt to prevent seniors from losing their homes due to unreasonable and unjust property taxes. He was a devoted husband, and the utmost of fathers, and grandfathers. He was selfless and compassionate, even with his stoic exterior. His wife, daughters and grandsons couldn't have asked for better. Parkinson's and Lewy Body ravaged his strong body and brilliant mind in the last few years. We celebrate that he is free from that body, yet are devastated to lose him.
